It was a transformational moment for me. For a minute, I was transported back to another time in my life, as if I had just boarded a magical time machine. The world around me disappeared, and I was standing in the outdoor amphitheater in the corner of Camp Interlaken, in Eagle River, Wisconsin, next to boy's cabin B5. I was overlooking beautiful Lake Finley. It was Erev Shabbat. I was dressed in my wrinkled white button down shirt, almost clean, my black flood pants that I had outgrown (mom packed those because she didn't care if I lost them, which I most likely was going to do), and a pair of old beat up sneakers (of course no socks). This was my Shabbat best, worn once a week for the most special time of the week at camp.

It is a warm, humid evening. The mosquitoes are especially aggressive in that corner of camp because the trees and foliage are especially thick in that spot. The lake is perfectly smooth, like a pane of glass. The boats on the lake are all

put away for the day. The only sound is the echo of our voices off the perfectly still lake. When I sit on the bench, it is bit cold and damp, as it is made from a split birch tree from the north woods, natural and rustic, in an almost Disneyland kind of authenticity. I am standing there with my friends, whose names I can now barely remember.

Ateret is standing in the back of our outdoor sanctuary. I can still see her face, staring at my friends and I with that stern look. We're whispering and giggling about some dumb joke someone made. I can smell the Shabbat meal wafting out of the dining room and winding it's way down the broken asphalt path. It's the same meal we have at home, as if my own grandma was in charge of the kitchen. Dinner is the usual Chicken soup, baked chicken, and all of the usual accoutrements. It smells so good, and I am so hungry. I can't wait for services to end. Then it's dinner, singing and Israeli dancing.

My wife nudges me and brings me back to reality. I am grateful for such a beautiful memory. There was no better place to celebrate Shabbat than Camp Interlaken. The logistics of Camp Interlaken were perfect for a Shabbat observance. We were totally isolated from the outside world, giving us a real Shabbat, away from all of the noise and tumult of the world. In my life today, the best I can do is get away from the world for an hour or two. But at camp, it was truly Shabbat. What a great experience. The trip back was only for a minute or so, but that memory has always been with me. I had no idea then what an impact this one moment in time would have on my life, but it sure did.
